Yellowknife has a wonderful sense of community, diverse culture, a vibrant arts scene, access to big city amenities, and recreational opportunities that are as unique as the North itself.

The Workers' Safety and Compensation Commission (WSCC) of the Northwest Territories and Nunavut has exclusive jurisdiction in all matters affecting compensation for workers injured on the job, and is responsible to administer occupational health and safety legislation for all workers and employers within the Northwest Territories and Nunavut. The WSCC promotes workplace safety and care for injured workers. The WSCC upholds the values of concern for people, collaboration, engagement, integrity, transparency and openness in the workplace.

We are looking for a Mining Engineer/Inspector of Mines to join our Prevention Services team in Yellowknife. Reporting to the Chief Inspector of Mines, the Mining Engineer administers the NWT and Nunavut *Mine Health and Safety Act and Regulations* and the *Explosives Use Act and Regulations*. The Mining Engineer conducts variety of evaluations of the engineering aspects of sites such as ground control design, mining methods, mine dump design, building structures and electrical systems. The incumbent also perform inspections, safety audits, and reviews of technical designs and drawings to ensure compliance with the appropriate acts, regulations, codes and standards, and conformance to engineering standards.

This position requires an Engineering degree in a relevant discipline from an accredited university and must be registered or eligible for registration as Professional Engineer in the NT and NU. The incumbent must have seven years of experience working at a mine or in the mining/exploration industry, to include at least five years spent in production operations, with a regulatory requirement of one-year supervisory experience at a mine.

Other requirements include excellent interpersonal and conflict resolution skills, and the ability to interpret *Acts and Regulations*. The ability to travel and a valid Class 5 Driver's license are essential. We will consider equivalencies on a case-by-case basis.

Salary ranges from \$45.16 to \$53.92 hourly (approx. \$88,062 to \$105, 144 annually), plus a northern allowance of \$3450 annually and a generous benefits package.

We require a satisfactory criminal records check for this position. This is a non-traditional occupation.
