- Are knowledgeable in various health, safety and environmental principles through educational courses and on-the-job training. QEC provides a multitude of in-house courses such as First Aid training, the WSCC's Go Safe: Work Smart, Fall Protection, General Environmental Awareness, etc...
- Wear the appropriate PPE for the task. QEC provides all employees with personal protection equipment as stipulated in the General Safety Regulations. QEC also provides specialized protection for employees such as customized ear plugs.
- Report incidents and assist with identifying future preventative measures. QEC strives to promote a strong safety culture whereby incidents and their reporting are learned upon and not swept under the rug.
- Care about the safety of others. QEC's Safety Program is based upon the principle of the Internal Responsibility System whereby everyone in the workplace is responsible for safety. Also, protecting the public from hazards and providing information such as power outage and meter safety on our website is a priority.

In all seriousness, the field of health and safety is constantly changing. With new studies and best practises continually arising and improving our workplaces for the better, QEC is also committed to change. Currently, we are improving upon our existing health and safety program, which is a large task.
